SUBJECT	TERMLY OVERVIEW
RE	<p><b>Journeys:</b> Children will learn about journeys people make together, journeys to church and that Mary, Joseph and Jesus made a journey to the temple.</p> <p><b>Communion:</b> Children will learn about the joy of coming together and the joy of gathering with the parish family at Mass.</p> <p><b>Growing:</b> Children will learn about different patterns of growth. They will learn that Lent is a time to grow and Easter is a celebration of growing.</p>
P.S.H.E.	<p><b>Rights and Responsibilities</b> - Care of a new baby. Kind/unkind behaviour. Right and Wrong. Rules - safety in the home. Community- people who help children in school.</p>
ENGLISH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Consonant clusters</li><li>• Recognise full stops/capital letters when reading.</li><li>• Words ending in double consonants.</li><li>• Demarcate sentences in writing with full stop/capital letter.</li><li>• Frequency words from Year 1 list.</li><li>• Write labels for drawings and diagrams.</li><li>• Plurals.</li><li>• Read fiction, poetry and non-fiction with understanding.</li></ul>
MATHS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Counting, properties of numbers and number sequencing.</li><li>• Adding and subtracting.</li><li>• Using mental strategies to solve simple problems.</li><li>• Measures and time including problems.</li><li>• Place value, ordering and estimating.</li><li>• Money and 'real life' problems.</li><li>• Organising and using data.</li></ul>

SCIENCE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Sound and hearing.</u></b> How do we hear? How does sound travel? How does the ear work?</li> <li>• <b><u>Light and Dark</u></b> - What things give us light? Can we see when it is dark?</li> <li>• <b><u>Forces-Pushes and Pulls.</u></b> How do things move? What affects the way things move? Natural forces and man-made forces.</li> </ul>
ICT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Describing things</u></b>-giving information using one or two keywords to describe an object to others. Identify objects from keywords given.</li> <li>• <b><u>Data collection</u></b>-using a graphic program to present data collected. Carry out a survey and collect data. Present data as a pictogram and explain findings thus presented to others.</li> </ul>
ART	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Sculpture</u></b>-make a collection of natural materials from local environment. Discuss the kind of environment from which the materials came from (woodland/seaside etc.).</li> <li>• Combine materials collected to form a sculpture which expresses the 'feel' of the environment in which the materials were found.</li> </ul>
HISTORY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Toys</u></b>-describe an artefact-how to find out about toys from the past.</li> <li>• Use vocabulary of time to talk about objects from the past.</li> <li>• Describe characteristics of 'old' and 'new' toys.</li> </ul>
GEOGRAPHY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Where in the World is Barnaby Bear?</u></b> - Looking at different places around the world that Barnaby has visited.</li> </ul>
DT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Moving Pictures</u></b>-mechanisms.</li> <li>• Make a card/picture with moving parts, incorporating a simple lever or sliding mechanism.</li> </ul>
PE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Games</u></b>-co-operation/ball skills/accuracy/personal fitness.</li> <li>• <b><u>Dance</u></b>-develop movement ideas from previous term.</li> <li>• Compose and link sequence of movements and select stimulus from a selection of musical instruments.</li> <li>• <b><u>Gymnastic</u></b> - Ways of travelling.</li> </ul>
MUSIC	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Pulse and Rhythm</u></b></li> <li>• Develop an awareness of phrase.</li> <li>• Sing with others.</li> <li>• Further develop control of pulse and rhythm.</li> </ul>
